Pastor's Page - April 2023

Then the people as a whole answered, "His blood be on us and our children!" Matthew 27:25

I shall give you my sincere advice:

First, to set fire to their synagogues or schools and to bury and cover with dirt whatever will not burn, so that no one will ever again see a stone or cinder of them. This is to be done in honor of our Lord and of Christendom, so that God might see that we are Christians, and do not condone or knowlingly tolerate such public lying, cursing, and blaspheming of his Son and of his Christians. ...

Second, I advise that their houses also be razed and destroyed. ...

Third, I advise that all their prayer books and Talmudic writings, in which such idolatry, lies, curses, and blasphemy are taught, be taken from them. ...

Fourth, I advise that their rabbis be forbidden to teach henceforth on pain of loss of life and limb. ...

Fifth, I advise that safe conduct on the highways be abolished completely for the Jews.

I am writing this article on this uplifting topic for two reasons: (1) It came up in Bible Study, and (2) the quotation above is from Matthew, and we hear in worship during Holy Week every three years.

There is so much I could say about this that I have written and rewritten this article several times. For the sake of simplicity and brevity, I only list my points:

1. Jesus tells us not to hate people (Matthew 6:43-45, Luke 6:27-31). Rather, Jesus tells us love our neighbor and then expands our definition of "neighbor" (Luke 10:25-37). This is the most important point - it's fundamental to the Christian faith and life - even though I think it is (or should be) the most obvious.

2. Still, Christians have missed #1. Often. For 2,000 years. Clearly, Luther missed the point. (Reading the above quotation makes me ill.) The Nazis used these words of Luther's *even though most Lutherans and most Germans appear to have forgotten about it*. Modern Lutherans renounce these words.

3. Sometimes, the authors of the New Testament talk about Jesus or the apostles as though they were not Jews (John 9:18, Acts 13:5, etc. - or at least, that's how we read them.) But that's simply not the case, as Matthew and Luke go <u>out of their way</u> to demonstrate (Matthew 1:1-18 and Luke 3:23-38) *even John knows* (John 4:9,22.)

4. The Jews are God's chosen people (Genesis 12:1-3, Romans 9:4-5, 11:26-29) and salvation comes from the Jews (Jesus says so himself, John 4:22.)

5. The Jews of the Bible are not the Jews of today. The ancient Israelites were different from Jews of the New Testament, both of them are different from the Jews today, just as we are not the same as the earliest Christians. 2,000+ years of history will do that.

6. *Even if the Jews were our enemies - which they are not - we should love them because Jesus tells us to love our enemies.*

7. Sometimes, we Christians can learn things from our Jewish neighbors about Scripture - yes, even the New Testament.

8. There are times when the Testament says (or appears to say) harsh things about Jews (Matthew 27:25 [above], Revelation 2:9.) For example, in the above quotation from Matthew, we have often read that as Jesus' blood being on the Jews. But I don't read it that way; I read <u>us</u> as "the people as a whole" which means that Jesus' blood is on us, not on Jews. This is all over the New Testament (John 1:29 & 3:16-17, Romans 5:6-21, Ephesians 2:11-22, etc.) Our Good Friday hymns would seem to agree; for example, in "Ah Holy Jesus" (LBW 123), we sing in verse 2 "Who was the guilty? Who brought this upon thee? Alas, my treason, Jesus hath undone thee. "Twas I Lord Jesus, I it was denied thee; I crucified thee."

So, to recap:

1. Luther was wrong, and the Nazis were wrong to use Luther to support their antisemitism.

- 2. The Bible was written by Jews, who are not the same as Jews today.
- 3. Jesus tells us to love our neighbors this includes our Jewish neighbors.
- 4. We put Jesus on the cross he died for us.

Luther Quotation of the Month:

When we are inclined to boast of our position we should remember that we are but Gentiles, while the Jews are of the lineage of Christ. We are aliens and in-laws; they are blood relatives, cousins, and brothers of our Lord. Therefore, if one is to boast of flesh and blood, the Jews are actually nearer to Christ than we are, as St. Paul says in Romans 9[:5]. God has also demonstrated this by his

acts, for to no nation among the Gentiles has he granted so high an honor as he has to the Jews. For from among the Gentiles there have been raised up no patriarchs, no apostles, no prophets, indeed very few genuine Christians either. And although the gospel has been proclaimed to all the world, yet He committed the Holy Scriptures, that is, the law and the prophets, to no nation except the Jews.
