Pastor's Page: First Things First

I am the Lord your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery; you shall have no other gods before me.

This pastor's page should come as no surprise. 😳

Do politics matter? Of course – our politicians make decisions and pass laws that impact our lives.

Your vote matters. There are a lot of reasons I could tell you to vote, but the most pastoral reason I can give: we are called to participate in our democracy for the sake of our neighbor.

But, as your pastor, the Church calls me to remind you of several fundamental Christian truths:

First, God is God and we are not. Whomever we elect, Jesus is still Lord and still loves us and

Second, we worship God, not our politicians. Our politicians do not love and cannot save us. In Christ, God has already done that.

Finally, Christ's return is not up to us. This election will not usher in the Apocalypse. Only God can do that.

So, take a breath – and don't buy into the hype. Pray for our nation. Pray for people who disagree with you. Pray that we do not tear ourselves apart. Pray for our leaders (because we Christians are commanded to do so: 1 Timothy 2:1-4).

We worship God, not politicians. God is in charge, and God loves us and will never leave us.

Now, go vote. Don't stop praying. And leave the rest to God.

Because what I tell the children is true, there's always only one right answer ... 🥹

A VERY IMPORTANT NOTE:

First, I'm not planning on going anywhere. Things are changing at Immanuel – for the better – and we need to adapt.

In 2021, Trevor led Immanuel to set a goal of being "self-sustaining" within 5 years. He wanted to make sure income exceeded expenses without pulling from savings.

And God gave that to us in under 2 years. I have quoted Trevor as saying that our growth has been miraculous, and everyone agrees that he chose the right word – miraculous. It was important that we celebrate and give thanks to God.

I also told council that Immanuel is not truly self-sustaining. Part-time pastors who do not need insurance are hard to find (at this point, *any* pastor is hard to find), and if I get hit by a bus tomorrow, Immanuel would struggle to find another one. At this point, let me clarify that *this is not about me*. The Office of Pastor matters. I do not. This is about being realistic about Immanuel's situation.

Also, you had a goal and smashed it. Everything I know about organizations is that we need a new goal now or we will stagnate – or worse.

Council agreed with my reasons (Trevor even quoted my words back at me at one point \mathfrak{S}), and has plotted a new series of goals, including working toward calling a full-time pastor. So your pastor's compensation package is going to increase as you work toward that goal.

While Trevor will discuss the particulars, if my compensation package is going to change by more than 10%, we need to track that change and include the synod office. This is to protect the pastor and the congregation, and to make sure that everyone is on the same page.

I cannot, in good conscience, accept a full-time call as an Army Reserve chaplain. Under this plan, I would retire from the Army around November 2026.

This may come as surprising news. While the council and I had some idea, we did not have all the facts until we met with Bishop Satterlee recently via Zoom. Now that Bishop, council, and I are all on the same page, we are bringing you on board.

Honestly, it was an exciting meeting because it is an exciting time at Immanuel. The bishop expressed how nice it was to have a meeting with a council to talk about how to respond to growth.

If you have any questions, I plan to be home to lead worship on Sunday, 27 October (Reformation Sunday 😊). Any council member should also be able to answer your questions, but if we're all stumped, Pr. Chrisy Bright will lead worship on Sunday, 3 November, and the bishop has promised to keep her posted so that she will definitely be able to answer any question about this process.

We will pray, grow, and plan together at our annual meeting on Sunday, 08 December after worship
