Pastor's Page, July 2025: Giving:

All tithes from the land, whether the seed from the ground or the fruit from the tree, are the Lord's; they are holy to the Lord.

- Leviticus 27:30

"No one can serve two masters; for a slave will either hate the one and love the other, or be devoted to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and wealth.

- Jesus, The Sermon on the Mount, Matthew 6:24

Each of you must give as you have made up your mind, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver.

2 Corinthians 9:7

Please note: If you read this looking for a loophole, you're going to miss the point. This isn't about "how can I rationalize what I'm doing now?" This is about our outlook on our Christian walk.

This month, I picked a scary word that no one likes to discuss and that comes across as self-serving because the pastor's salary depends upon your giving! But it's all over Scripture, so yup – let's talk about money!

But if you read the above passages, you may have noticed that they're not necessarily just about money. If you keep reading, you'll see that wealth is discussed in a lot of ways. In fact, it's one of Jesus' favorite topics.

But again, this isn't just about money. Because the question is one of focus. While Luther claims, quoting Jesus, that the world's most common idol is money, God doesn't just want your money: He wants all of you.

And he doesn't just want you. God wants all of us, and all of each of us.

That's why we've switched back to an older form of the Offertory Prayer. Because Christians have always believed that God gives us all that we have and all that we are. And we say it together because it's not about me or you – it's about all of us.

"Merciful Father. We offer with joy and thanksgiving what you have first given us: our SELVES, our TIME, and our POSSESSIONS, signs of your gracious love...." (emphases mine)

Think about those words. There's a lot there; they're powerful words. AND THAT'S JUST THE FIRST HALF OF THE PRAYER! They say a lot about God and about us. And, while I'm not always the most

joyful or thankful, these words are aspirational – what we should aspire to believe, be, and do. That's why we say them every week, so that they become a part of us.

And we pray them together because it's important for everyone to feel their impact as the words come out of our mouth. And they're a prayer, so we're saying them to God.

As the prayer indicates, this is about so much more than money; it's about a life lived for Jesus. And not just in and through a congregation – all the time.

Notes from Pastor Chris:

The bishop-elect is coming! As Sharon mentioned in her article on our back pack drive, Bishop-elect Julie Schneider-Thomas, elected at our synod assembly in May, will join us to preach and pack backpacks on Sunday, 17 August. If at all possible, **please plan to attend worship that day**; she has said that she wants to get to know us, and this will be a great opportunity for us to get to know her as well.

We found a nursery attendant! Well, strictly speaking, she found us. Makayla Slater came to our Memorial Day luncheon, and when she expressed interest in seeing our nursery, I asked if she would like to be our nursery attendant once school starts. We have invited her to attend worship before then so that we can introduce her to the congregation.

As I said in a previous newsletter, I prefer not to make unilateral decisions; I prefer to have time to take decisions to council or the All Committee Meeting. I have also noticed, in general, that quick decisions are less well-examined and usually aren't as good as decisions that have been examined by more than one set of eyes (and when someone walks through our doors looking for something from us, haste is sometimes a tactic that some folks use to prevent clear decision-making).

I will be attending Confirmation Camp (they call it something else, but that's what it is) with our Confirmands (Carter, Grady, and Izzy) from 6 – 11 July.

Because the weather is now "hot" by almost everyone's definition, and because I HATE the heat, the air conditioning in my office will likely be set to a temperature I find conducive to working (a temperature which many of you would define as "cold"). In order to use as little energy as possible, I will probably being keeping my office door closed, even when I'm in the office. Please don't hesitate to knock – I'm not trying to keep you out, I'm trying to keep the cool air in.

Also because the weather is warmer, the glass front doors have expanded, which means that they don't always close tightly. If you are the last person in the building, please make sure the doors are closed and latched when you leave.

Through July and August, I will probably arrive a little later on Sunday mornings than I do during the school year. No need to worry about me until at least 9:15am. 3

Backpack Ministry Update:



It's a big deal to supply 100 backpacks to the Middle Schooler's in our community so we wanted to give you an update on our progress so far!

- Our monetary goal is \$2,000 this year
- We have nearly \$1,400 so far (rummage sale, mid week Lenten services, etc.)
- Many personal care items (deodorant, combs, hand sanitizer) already collected so far
- Keep bringing in personal care items to keep the kids clean and safe (especially combs, hand sanitizer and deodorant)
- 150 water bottles purchased with a Thrivent grant card
- A second Thrivent grant card will help purchase 100 trapper keepers
- Watch for a giving tree with specific school supplies tags (mid-July)
- Allegan United Methodist Church is helping us and Plainwell Hope Lutheran Church

What do we need to pull this off you ask?

- 100 backpacks (we have them leftover from last year and purchased a few more!)
- 200 spiral notebooks (110 in our current inventory)
- 1,000 pencils (450 in our current inventory)
- 100 trapper keepers
- 100 packages of mechanical pencils
- 100 envelope pencil holders (we have 1)
- 100 packages of colored pencils (32 in our current inventory)
- 100 packages of cap erasers
- 500 folders
- 100 packages of highlighters
- 100 water bottles (Thanks to Thrivent we are all set)

What will we use the \$2,000 for?

- Purchase 100 trapper keepers ~ they are around \$15 each
- Purchase personal care items we don't get such as bandaids, hand sanitizer, etc.
- Purchase the school supplies we don't get from the list above

We already purchased 50 more backpacks

August 17, 2025 after worship our new **Bishop-elect Julie Schneider-Thomas** will join us to fill the backpacks for delivery the next day! We hope you will join us as well.
